To identify hot & cold areas of the world (in relation to the Equator and North & South Poles) and which clothing is appropriate for both.	Say what they like about their own & others work using simplistic artistic vocabulary.
To use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to weather and name physical or human features of familiar places.	Begin to use sketch books to explore & experiment with different mediums.
